

NZTR DIRECTIVE

Horse Movement

Effective 8 June 2009

At the 8 June 2009 Board meeting, the Board of New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing considered and issued the following Directive:

Trainers who intend campaigning their horses away from their registered stable for a period of eight or more days must complete a Horse Movement Notification Form and send to NZTR prior to the date of departure.

Additionally, for horses away from their registered stable location for more than 28 days, authority must be sought by the NZTR Board (in writing signed by the Chief Executive) for a trainer to operate more than one stable or for the horse to be transferred to another stable.

Reason:

This directive has been issued for the following reasons:

- Knowing who is in charge of the horse(s) on raceday
- Knowing the location of all horses in the wake of a disease outbreak
- Making punters aware of the actual location of the horse(s)
- Making NZTR aware of the location of horse(s)
- In light of a positive sample, knowing the location of the horse(s).

Rule of Racing Relating to Directives:

106(b)

Every person commits a breach of these Rules who:

[...]

acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any provision of these Rules or any Regulations made thereunder, or any notice, direction, instruction, requirement or condition given, made or imposed under these Rules;
