



NZTR DIRECTIVE

Presenting Horses On Course

Effective 1 August 2009

At the 6 July 2009 Board meeting, the Board of New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing considered and issued the following directive:

Trainers must ensure that they present their horse(s) in the tie-up stalls/saddling area no later than one hour prior to the advertised starting time of the horse's race.

Reason:

This directive has been issued for the following reasons:

- For Integrity purposes, to assist with the monitoring of the horses prior to racing.
- To assist with any pre-race testing that maybe undertaken prior to their race.
- To ensure that horses are presented on course in time to compete.

Rule of Racing Relating to Directives:

106(b)

Every person commits a breach of these Rules who:

acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any provision of these Rules or any Regulations made thereunder, or any notice, direction, instruction, requirement or condition given, made or imposed under these Rules;
